



## English Language Summer School: 9<sup>th</sup> – 27<sup>th</sup> August 2010

English for Study Purposes is a **3-week programme** for students who wish to improve their academic English in an interesting way: by learning about Scottish culture and the city of Glasgow. Students find out about Scotland and Glasgow and improve their English for study purposes at the same time through a programme of trips, lectures, and classroom activities and tutorial support. Students will interact with Scottish people and write a small research project.

### Programme Structure and Content:

- 15 hours per week English language improvement for study and social purposes.
- Academic lectures by University of Glasgow Faculty.
- Trips: 2 full day trips and 6 half day trips exploring Scottish culture in historical places.
- Accompanied social activities: 2 evenings a week at a variety of Glasgow's leisure venues.
- Plus 1:1 tutorials, guided self-study, and project work.

**Class size:** 10–15 students

### Course Fee: £1,650 including

- All Course materials
- Tuition/educational visits/social programme
- Use of AV library and leisure facilities
- Certificate of Attendance
